Student Wages and Funding Opportunities

Student wages are set by employers.

Both the provincial and federal governments offer incentives to employers who create work experience opportunities for Manitoba students.

Through Manitoba's Paid Work Experience Tax Credits, eligible employers who hire UWinnipeg Co-op students can claim 15% of wages and salaries – up to \$5,000 per student.

Eligible employers can also apply for wage subsidies to hire post-secondary students through the Federal Student Work Placement Program (FSWPP). For more information about FSWPP and the provincial tax credit, please visit uwinnipeg.ca/coop-program.
