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Registration

Regulations Related to Course Scheduling

Students have a prescribed schedule, and have been assigned specific courses and sections of the curriculum. Yearly schedules all the activities, assignments, classes and academic commitments.

Senior Years Groups

Senior team students in the In Rega ed Program have been assigned the following (Senior team students in the Affe Degree students have been assigned a separate group). Senior Years Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment Courses

Year 5 Senior Year students will continue taking specialized Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment (CIA) courses in the major and minor subjects.

Senior Years Advanced Curricular Inquiry (ACI)

Students will be assigned a section of EDUC-4761 SY(9-12) Advanced Curricular Inquiry (ACI). The purpose of the ACI course is for students to engage in a research project, the objectives of the student learn plan and enact the effective grounded-in practice and identify building professional learning.

Practicum Blocks III and IV

Students will register for the extended block of practicum in Year 5. Practicum block are offered in extended block numbers, and are each worth 3 credit hours. In addition to the registration fee, students will be charged a supplemental practicum fee for a total of \$186.50 per block (\$373 for the year).

Students will register for EDUC-4776-150 Practicum Block III SY in the Fall term, and EDUC-4777-150 Practicum Block IV SY in the Winter term. Please ensure that you register for the extended practicum block.

In addition to the extended block, students must attend the full day half day one week in the high school. Students must attend the full day half day high school schedule, and are not eligible for full registration for the week of student teaching time.

Other Year 5 Courses

Each group has been assigned a section of the following courses: EDUC-4401 Job and Effective Schools; EDUC-4405 Content Analysis in Inservice Education; and EDUC-4604 Classroom-Based Assessment.

Regulations Related to Course Scheduling

Permission to Register Over Capacity

Individual instructors cannot grant permission to register over capacity in their courses. Permission can only be obtained from the Faculty of Education Office, and will only be considered if the educational objectives have been documented in the course. Instructors who have been requested for a course that has been over-enrolled for a semester, and are unable to be replaced, will be notified in writing. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.

We encourage the highest enrollment in all courses. This will not occur if there has been a late change in the schedule, such as a course being canceled or rescheduled.

Condensed Courses

In order to accommodate the student teaching block, certain courses will be offered in a condensed format, which can be completed before the student teaching begins. Condensed courses may be offered in the Fall term, the Winter term, across both Fall and Winter terms. Each term will consist of one week of lectures and seminars, followed by a student teaching block. Student teaching will take place in either a home area or during the evening. It is important to be able to make a full commitment to the course and student teaching in order to get the most benefit from your education.

Attendance Policy

The Bachelor of Education Program leads to a professional degree. Students are expected to attend, be punctual and participate in all classes. The degree is an acknowledgment of the importance of the teaching and learning process and the professional responsibilities of each class.

Students are encouraged to attend and participate in all school activities. **However, students must ensure that no conflict occurs between the school activity and their attendance in class. Students are not to miss University classes for school activities.**

French, Kinesiology, Mathematics

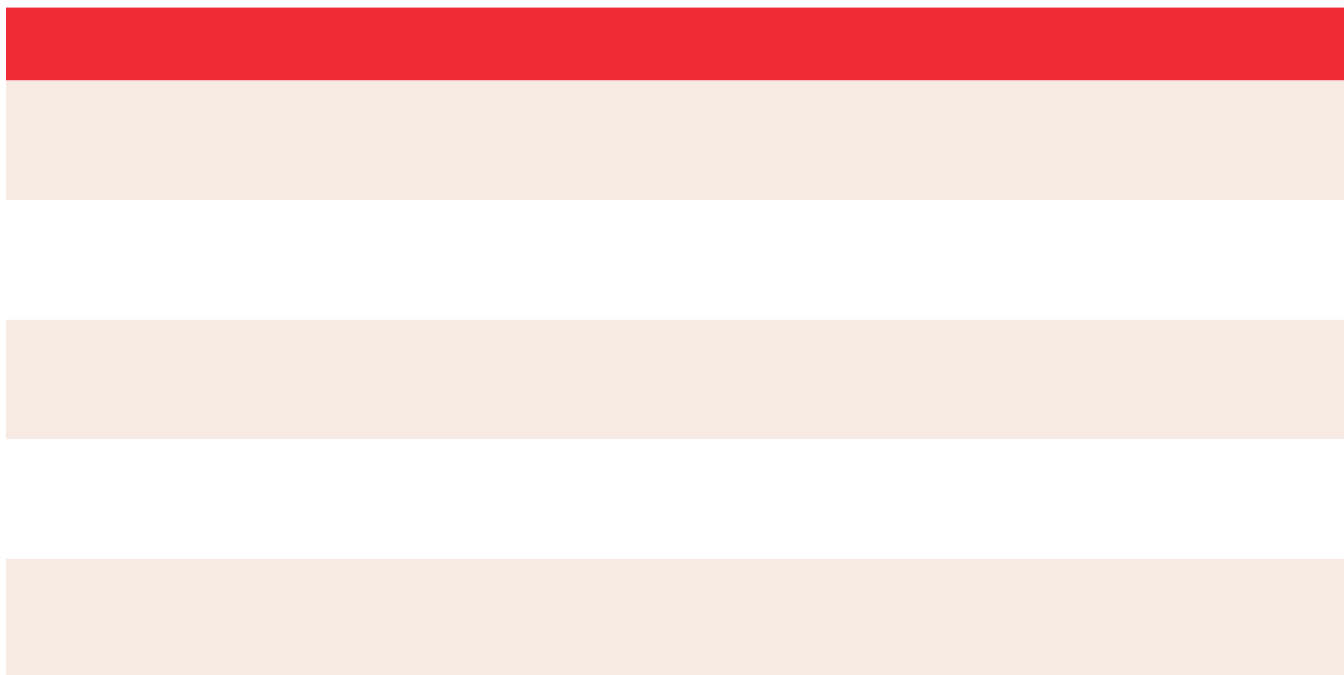
